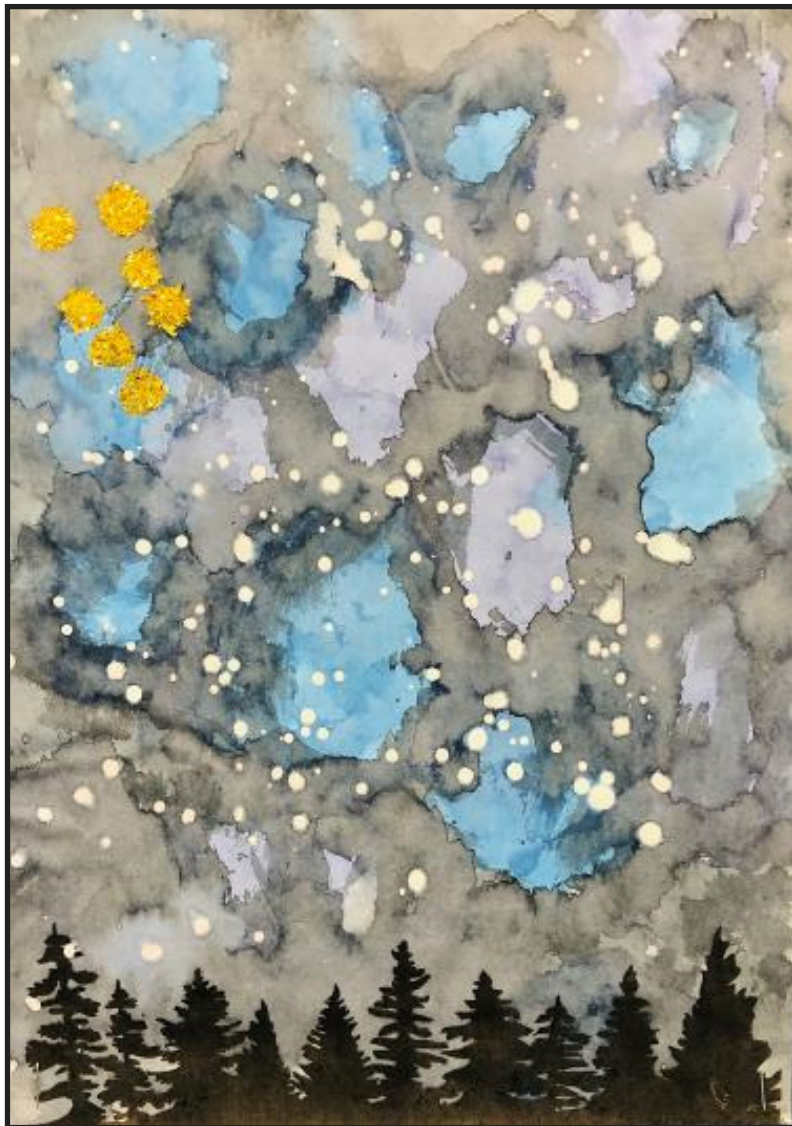

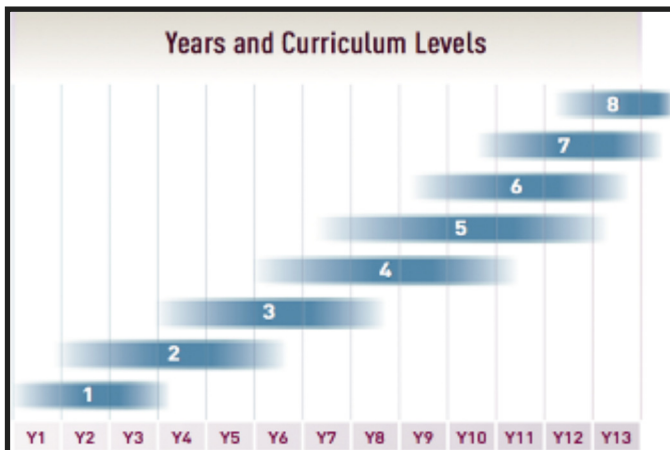

Dear Parents and Caregivers

With only two weeks until the school holidays, teachers and learners are all very busy completing the planned learning for Term 2. Mid-year reports will come home with your child on Thursday 4 July.

As you are no doubt aware, reporting against National Standards is no longer a requirement, however, we are still obliged to report achievement for each child, both individually to parents and collectively to the board and the school community. To fulfil this obligation, we are transitioning to reporting against curriculum levels from the NZ Curriculum.



This graphic illustrates the expectations of achievement during your child's time at school.

Please note that the general expectation is that a child achieves one level of the curriculum over a period of two years throughout the first ten years of schooling. This is a general pattern. Some children achieve more quickly, others more slowly. This is normal, so please bear this in mind when you read your child's report.

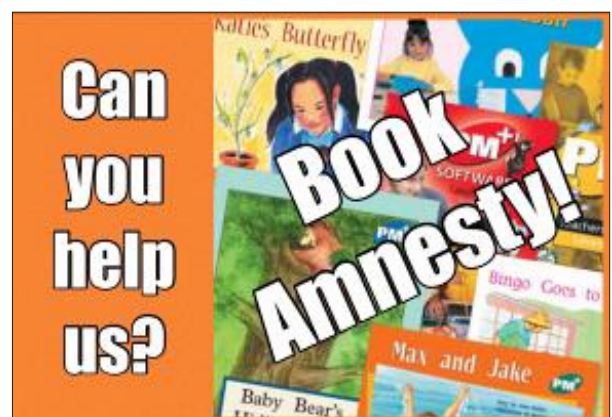
Lost Property

Community Notices

- June 2019 is New Zealand's first **Klinefelters awareness month**. Klinefelters is when males have XXY chromosomes, rather than XY (47 chromosomes rather than 46) - also known as 47XXY or XXY. Klinefelters is one of the most common chromosome conditions with 1 in 600 live male births having the duplicated X chromosome. Some are mosaic, with only some of the X chromosomes duplicated & others have all their X chromosomes duplicated. Autism is common in XXY'S. Klinefelters is a spectrum, with a lot of men living normal lives, only finding out they have it when having problems trying to conceive, as it makes most infertile. Others have trouble learning in school or may have a severe learning disability. They may have low muscle tone & puberty may be delayed. 29 June there is a meet-up for XXY'S, friends & families.
