Marsden Bay Camp

A reminder that Kauri (C5) Camp will be held at Marsden Bay Christian Camp, 89 One Tree Point, Ruakaka (www.marsdenbay.co.nz) from Wednesday 3 April to Friday 5 April 2024. This is two nights and three days in Week Ten of Term One.

Purpose of Camp:

- to provide students with an authentic, outdoor education experience, in a safe and supportive environment
- to participate in outdoor education activities that will foster cooperation, team-work and individual challenge
- to provide an opportunity for students to recognise their strengths, limitations, and ability to cope successfully in an unfamiliar environment
- to develop students' confidence and awareness of personal responsibility
- to encourage students to challenge themselves (challenge by choice)

Camp Costs:

In order for us to cover costs relating to accommodation, food, and camp activities, a donation of \$170 per child would be appreciated. This subsidised cost helps us with accommodation and transport. This can be paid in instalments beforehand, either through the school office or via internet banking. We do ask that payment is finalised before Camp happens. We value the learning that our school camp provides but understand the financial pressures facing many families at this time. We are committed to finding solutions that might relieve such pressures. Please talk to us if you have any questions.

Consent and Medical Forms:

Consent and Medical forms are also attached with this notice. Please ensure you complete all sections and give us as much information as possible about your child. Please also let us know if we can support you in any way to complete these forms. **We would like to have these back by Friday 23 February.**

Gear List:

Please take the time to look through our camp gear list and ensure your child is organised with everything they need. If there are items on the list that you do not have, please do not go out and spend extra money to purchase these, as we are sure that family members and friends might be able to lend you the items. Kauri teachers are also really happy to help with this.

Following this, those parents/caregivers who are assisting with camp supervision will stay for an additional briefing from 6:30-7pm
