

# Kahikatea News Term 2 2024

Welcome to our Kahikatea students, families and friends,

Here is a brief overview of the learning experiences you can expect to see happening in Kahikatea in Term Two:

#### **Our Learning Goals**

#### Science (The Living World) and New Zealand Histories

Through the context 'Ngāhere Kaitiaki - Guardians of Our Forest', and focus on Kahikatea and Harakeke, students will:

- learn the versatility and traditional uses of these native plants
- discover history about the trading of harakeke in Aotearoa, New Zealand
- engage in the planting of edible plants at our school and native trees at Kōwhai Park
- create iMovies, retelling the legend of how Māui slowed the sun
- make woven toys, flowers, and visual art from Harakeke

#### Reading

- enjoy the novel, 'The Wild Robot' by Peter Brown, through shared reading
- learn to skim, scan and summarise information in non-fiction texts

#### Writing

- craft information reports and explanations
- learn effective note-taking, sentence structure, paragraphing and tools to proofread and edit
- create a narrator's script, retelling the legend of how Māui slowed the sun

#### **Mathematics**

- learn facts and problem-solving strategies relating to multiplication, division and fractions
- explore measurement concepts with a focus on volume, mass and capacity

## **Health and Physical Education**

- develop skills to invade and defend space in games such as Rugby, Hockey, Soccer, Netball and Rippa Rugby
- discover more about food and nutrition through the 'Food for Thought' programme
- learn and present a choreographed dance through scaffolded sessions

#### The Arts

- express ideas through music, dance and drama, presenting to an informal audience
- create Nicky Lowe inspired art with emphasis on foreground, background and contrasting thick, thin lines

#### Our Home Learning or 'Homework'

This term, home learning will be prepared each Friday and sent home each Monday. In preparation for Year Seven and beyond, our students should complete between 30-40 minutes each day they are able.

# Reading

Reading remains the priority for home learning. Students may be given a book to read by their teacher or required to select their own book from our school library each week. If you require specific reading material, please let us know.

#### **Mathematics**

Again, in preparation for Year Seven and beyond, it is essential that your child knows as many of their basic facts as possible (particularly the multiplication facts), from memory. For this reason, we will send home practice sheets each week. Your child should aim to improve their speed and accuracy.

#### Spelling

Each child will have a set of 'Essential Spelling Words' included in their home learning books this term. Focus on one 'list' at a time. Which words can your child already spell correctly? Which words do they need to practise? Choose 3-5 words to practise each week.

Please remember Book Bags each day to protect books, notices and home learning books.
