## **Kia ora Parents and Caregivers**

While the walk is an important part of our wellbeing, the real purpose is to raise funds to upgrade the junior sandpit and enhance the school gardens and environment.

#### **School Athletics**

Children will rotate around a circuit of athletic disciplines including sprints, high jump, discus, shot put, long jump. Please encourage your child to practice running, jumping and throwing at home or in the local park whenever you can.

We are fortunate to have the support of Northland Cricket to assist us with physical activity and skill development. All learners will have the opportunity to train with two cricket coaches from Northland Cricket over the coming weeks. Learners in Years 3 – 6 will complete their training sessions on 2 November, learners in Years 1 – 2 will receive their training from 21 – 23 November.

#### **Out of Zone Enrolment Vacancies**


Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office or on the school website <a href="www.warkworth.school.nz">www.warkworth.school.nz</a>. The Board has determined that Out of Zone Applications for the start of 2024 be invited for a total of 15 spaces: 5 in Year 5 and 10 in Year 6 only. The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

Applications are now invited for out of zone students. Application forms are available from the school website (www.warkworth.school.nz). The deadline for receipt of applications is 13 October 2023.

Parents of students who live within the home zone and intend enrolling their child at any time during this year should notify the school by 13 October 2023 to assist the school to plan appropriately. Students who live in the home zone are entitled to enrol at the school.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required, it will be held on 18 October 2023. Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three days of the ballot being held.


